

In Firenze, visit the *studiolo* of Francesco I, where in 1570 he attempted to gather artefacts that represented the order of the world, a wunderkammern in its own right.

While in Firenze, you can visit the Medici villa in nearby Pratolina, where the elaborate palace garden was used as a memory theatre to its visitors, with its different schemes representing the unity of art and nature and the harmony of the world.
